1 Peter 2:21-25

1 Peter 2:21-25

²¹ For you have been called for this purpose, since Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example for you to follow in His steps, ²² WHO COMMITTED NO SIN, NOR WAS ANY DECEIT FOUND IN HIS MOUTH; ²³ and while being reviled, He did not revile in return; while suffering, He uttered no threats, but kept entrusting Himself to Him who judges righteously;

²⁴ and He Himself bore our sins in His body on the cross, so that we might die to sin and live to righteousness; for by His wounds you were healed. ²⁵ For you were continually straying like sheep, but now you have returned to the Shepherd and Guardian of your souls.

1. Jesus died for our sins on the cross.

He Himself bore our sins in His body on the cross.

2. Jesus died that I might die to a sinful lifestyle.

...so that we might die to sin.

1 Pet. 2:24

Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. Rom. 6:4

3. Jesus died that I might live a righteous life.

...and live to righteousness.

1 Pet. 2:24

...knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, is never to die again; death no longer is master over Him.

Rom. 6:9

4. How to live for God – Rom. 6:10-13

- a. Consider yourself dead to sin – alive to God.
- b. Do not allow sin to control you obeying its lusts.
- c. Do not present your body as an instrument of sinful actions.
- d. Present yourself to God, alive from the dead.
- e. Present yourself to God as an instrument of righteousness.
